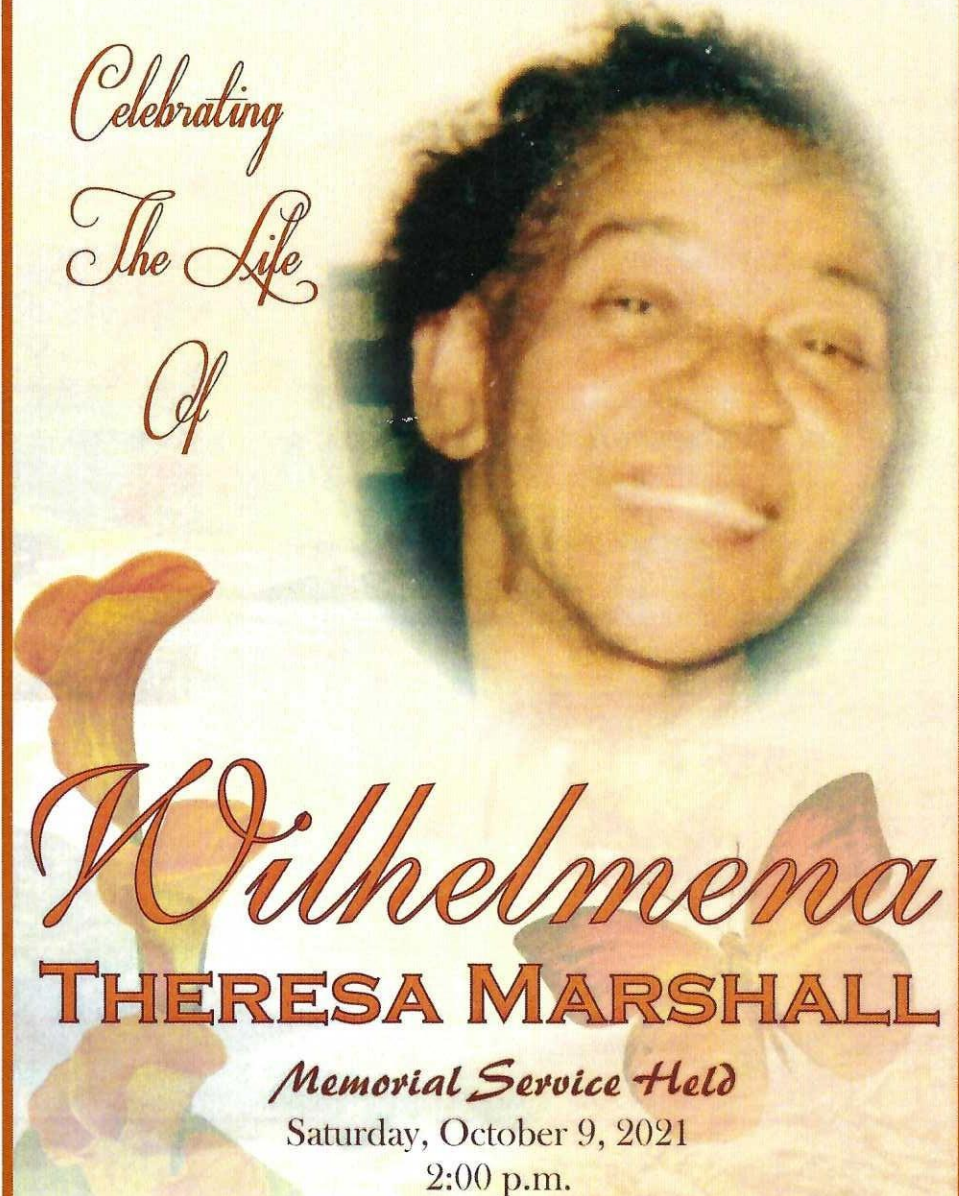

*Now is the only time we own*

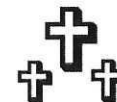
*Let us live, love and toil with a will*

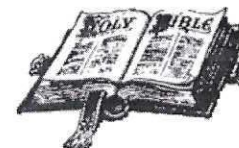
